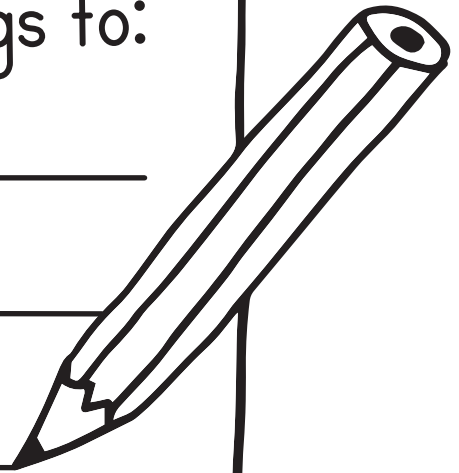

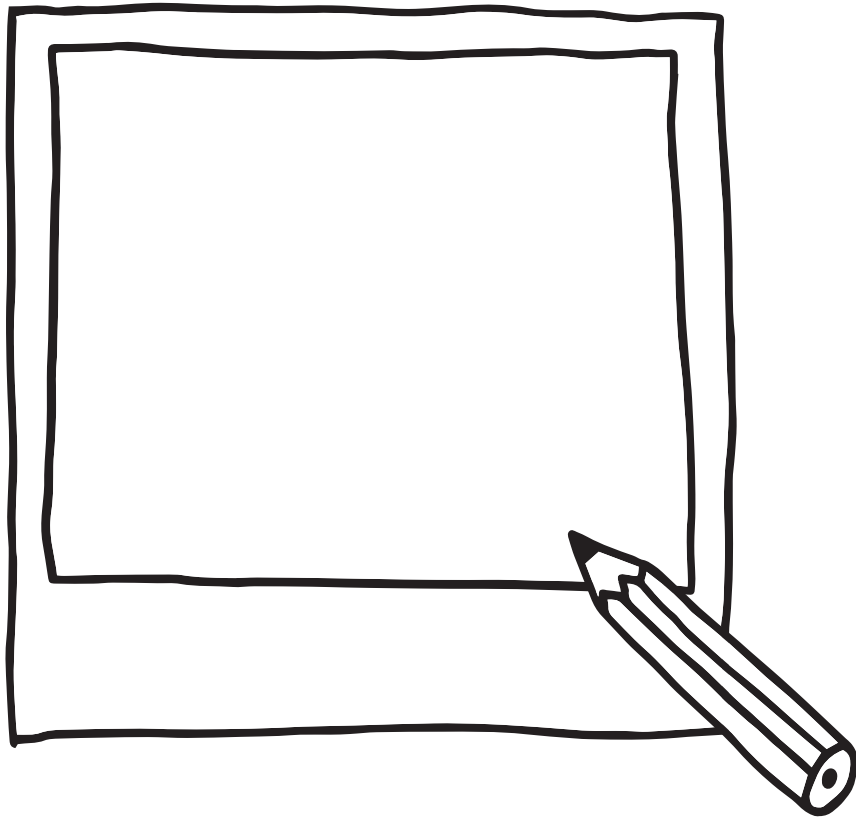

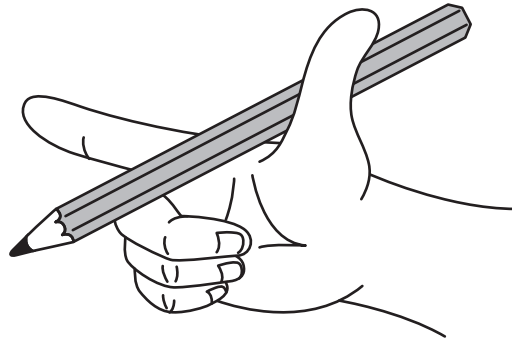

How to Hold a Pencil (Pen) Properly?

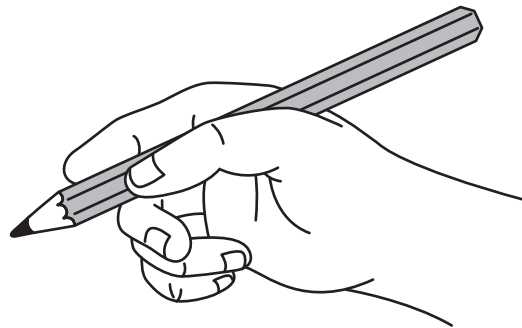

Position your fingers: Place your index finger and thumb at an angle of about 90 degrees. Place the pen or pencil on the crook between these fingers, it should rest on your bent middle finger.

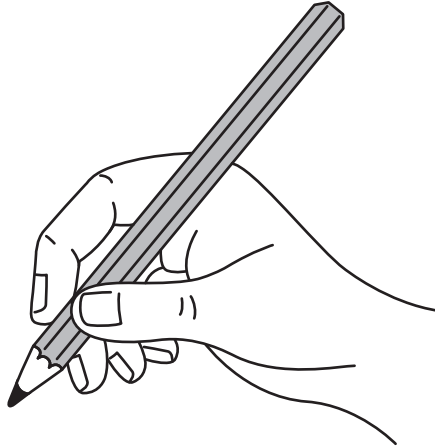
Clamp the pencil (pen) down: Gently hold the tool with your thumb and forefinger. Try not to squeeze too tight so that your hand remains relaxed and it doesn't hurt.

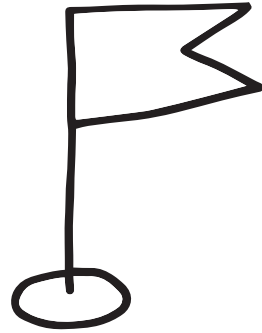
Pencil (Pen) position: Hold the pencil (pen) with slightly bent fingers and your wrist relaxed. This will help you to write without tension.
